

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Members must show tickets at the gate.
2. Persons, who are Indoor Exhibitors at the Annual Show and are not members, will be required to pay entry at the gate.
3. Every exhibit of plants or vegetables must have been the property of the exhibitor for not less than one month.
- 4. If a judge feels an entry is not worthy of a 1st place it may be withheld.**
5. The decision of the Judges shall be final, except where the regulations have been infringed.
6. The judge's decision is final, and if an exhibitor is not happy, please lodge a protest in writing with the Secretary no later than 4pm on the day, which the award is made.
A deposit of 50% of the value of the prize must accompany each protest, which may be forfeited if the protest be deemed frivolous.
7. The committee reserves the right to make any alteration in the published program.
- 8. Exhibits for competition or exhibition must be in their places in the Show Pavilion not later than 5.30pm Thursday night before show.**
9. Any persons or exhibitors interfering with the judges or stewards will be disqualified and prizes forfeited.
- 10. All indoor exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor.**
11. If deemed necessary by the committee, any exhibitor or prize winner may be called upon to make a statutory declaration as to the bona fides of any exhibit for competition and noncompliance may render the prize liable to forfeiture.
12. The Show pavilion will be open after judging on Friday.
13. No cattle & sheep to leave the showgrounds before 4pm Saturday without the permission of the convenor/s or the stewards.
14. No tents, booths, or hawkers will be allowed on the showgrounds without the permission of the secretary.
15. Entries must be made on the official entry form and each form is to have one individual name only (clearly printed in capital letters)
16. Every facility is given to the exhibitors, but the committee will not undertake any responsibility for any exhibit.
17. This Society is affiliated with the SE of SA and the Border Show Societies Association and any exhibitor or exhibit subject to disqualification by that Association or by any Show Society affiliated with that Association will be debarred from competition at the Show of this Society during the period of such disqualification or until any appeal that may have been lodged against such disqualification shall have been determined. Notification of any disqualification will be forwarded to the South East and Border Show Societies Association, or appropriate bodies, by this Society.
18. All competitors compete at their own risk.

This award is conducted by SA Country Shows who will be duly responsible for selecting the state winner during the course of each Royal Adelaide Show. All entrants who enter the award must provide an undertaking that they will abide by the regulations and entry conditions as set out and to abide by the decisions of SA Country Shows. The rules and regulations apply to all three levels of this award: country show society, association and state levels. The award will be run by qualification through country shows to association finals with a state final being held during the Royal Adelaide Show.

AIMS:

- To highlight the importance of youth in rural South Australia and in particular the agricultural show movement.
- To identify and encourage enthusiastic, skillful, industrious and unselfish young people.
- To give young people a forum to express their views through education and experience and develop closer links with the primary industries in South Australia.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS: Entrants must:

- Apply for and complete the entry form available from the Convenor or www.sacountryshows.com
- Agree to provide information indicating their reasons for applying for entry together with CV: indication work experience, community participation and agricultural show involvement.
- Be residents of South Australia.
- **Rural Ambassador Award entrants must be aged 20 years and under 30 years** as of the 1st May.
- **Young Rural Ambassador Award entrants must be ages 16 years and under 20 years** on the 1st May.
- Be enthusiastic and knowledgeable about rural life and affairs and agricultural shows.
- As a state finalist consent for your name and contact details to be made available on the SA Country Shows website for show societies should they wish to contact you.
- Be able to spend the required time at the local show, association level finals and be available to attend the Royal Adelaide Show. Details at www.sacountryshows.com

MOWERS @ MILLICENT 2024



Lawn mower racing has been taking place in Australia since the late 80's when a bunch of Snowy Mountain famers settled a dispute by racing their ride on lawnmowers down a steep hill with no brakes and engines off. It took a little longer for it to reach SA, with SALMRA's first race at Boobowrie in 2018. Since then, SALMRA has been supporting local communities and charities through a different kind of motor sport.

SALMRA races are held throughout the year in small towns around SA, ranging from Cape Jervis to Morgan and Meningie, with Millicent being the Grand Finale of the

season. They don't race for prize money, but for bragging rights, and most importantly, to have some fun and support small towns with all proceeds from the day going back into the local community.

Lawn mower racing is a fun, low-cost family friendly sport with junior classes from 8 years old and adult classes ranging from a standard mower with its deck removed all the way up to the super modified A class running 450cc motorbike engines. It is certainly a sight to be seen!

2024, for the first time, will see some Friday night Lawnmower action under lights at the old motocross track – come for a look!

RFID Numbers are needed, as per PIRSA requirements. Any cattle not scanned, will not be entered or judged.

Sectional Regulations G1 and G2

1. Accredited JBAS STATUS 7+ & 6+ area available for stud cattle.
2. JBAS STATUS must also be noted on ALL entry forms
3. National Cattle Health Declarations forms MUST be attached to ALL entry forms.
4. Johne's Disease & Enzootic Bovine Leucosis (EBL) Disease. A declaration that both diseases are not known to exist on property within the previous 5 years.

Commercial Cattle - G1 Rules & Regulations

- a) JBAS STATUS to be 6 plus.
- b) Ownership: All entries to be the property of the exhibitor for at least 3 months prior to the competition.
- c) Live Judging: Entries will be judged for maturity, quality, conformation and degree of finish. Judging will be on the hoof only.

Entry Fee: \$2.50. Prize Money: 1st \$30, 2nd \$20, 3rd \$10.

Entries: Maximum of two (2) entries per person per class. Calves to be born 2024.

1. Merrett Livestock PPHS Millicent Commercial cow with heifer calf at foot
2. Nutrien Millicent Commercial cow with steer calf at foot

Beef Cattle - G2 All Breeds Classic - Rules & regulations

1. All cattle must have been taught to lead & will be tied where directed by stewards.
2. All exhibits will be paraded for judging on day of Show as directed by stewards.
3. Age of beef cattle to date from day of show.
4. All animals must be the property of the exhibitor (At Convener's discretion)
5. All animals must be registered with their respective breed societies.
6. All bulls must be rung through the nose.
7. Bulls must have neck collars while tied up.
8. All animals must wear neck cards, with class/age displayed, when showing.
9. Calves at foot CAN be entered in Under 16- month classes

Entry Fee: \$6. Prize Money: Classes 1 – 25

Two entries: 1st \$15. Three or more entries: 1st \$15, 2nd \$10, 3rd \$5

Pair & Group Classes







A FEW HINTS FOR COOKING.

1. Read all instructions carefully
2. Display is important. Use medium size paper plates where there are several articles in a class
3. For larger cakes – cardboard cut slightly larger than the cake and covered with foil is quite satisfactory
4. Where there are several items in a class, look for uniformity both as to size and degree of cooking
5. A slice should be a slice (not a square) approx 2 – 2.5 x 7 – 6.5cm is a good size
6. In classes such as slices and sweets each pair should be identical
7. Avoid cake rack markings. Only use paper on base for fruit cakes, lighter cakes use melted butter and flour methods. NO cooking sprays
8. Iced cakes to be undecorated unless otherwise stated
9. These tips would apply in both open and junior classes

TIPS FOR EXHIBITORS IN SHOWING ROSES

- NND – Not Necessarily Distinct
 - Name your rose if possible
 - Leaves should be left on poor foliage is better than no foliage
 - Face rose exhibit toward the judge & secure stem with cork, wad of paper or polystyrene
- (1) A stem is an original new growth which carries one bloom OR one bud. Disbudding is allowed
 - (2) A cut is similar to a stem that carries more than one bloom and /or bud or buds
 - (3) A bud is the unexpanded stage of a rose flower with NO petals unfurling. In the bud to full bloom exhibit, colour must be showing
 - (4) A full bloom must have centre or stamens showing

A bowl is a container, the height being less than the diameter.

A vase is a container, the height being more than the diameter.

A bowl is viewed from the front, unless otherwise specified in the show schedule.

When the number of cuts or stems are specified they are counted at the level of the top of the container.






